Village Hall

Opportunity for a new lease of life!

A little history: Since the post war arrival of the village hall in Wimbotsham from Bexwell airfield, the hall building has been owned by the parish council, though the land it stands on was leased from a trust set up by the Hare family. The lease for the land being renewed every six years.

This gave rise to a degree of uncertainty about the tenure and precluded the village hall from obtaining grant funding. In 2014 the parish council proposed to purchase the land and thereby secure its future. After some negotiation the parish council purchased the land earlier this year and this not only secures the future of the site for the village but opens up new opportunities for the ageing village hall building.

So technically a new 'Freehold' rather than leasehold of life for the village hall!

Management of the village hall is carried out by the village hall committee, an entirely separate committee from the parish council, though the parish council is represented on the committee.

Help and ideas welcome!



Working Party:

With the new opportunity the land ownership brings, a village hall working party has been set up to look at the options for the hall's future. The first meeting was held on 14 July 2015.

The meeting commenced with discussions around the need for a new hall, where a new hall should be sited or whether renovations/modernisation on the existing hall would be more appropriate. Most of the members present at the meeting stated that they felt at this time that renovation/modernisation of the existing hall was the way forward.

It was acknowledged that full consultation with the residents of Wimbotsham and Stow Bardolph must take place.

It had already been decided in previous meetings that a consultation evening with public invite should take place during September and a date was set:

22 September - 7.30pm

It was agreed to prepare a village questionnaire prior to the September meeting, to be returned by 25 Aug 2015.

Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Parish Meeting was held in the village hall on 19th May.

The parish Chairman Jackie Squires gave the following report:

The Parish Council continue to develop and grow and strives hard to make decisions in the best interests of its residents. As Chair I aim for objectivity when debating agenda items and seek comment from all Councillors before moving forward with decisions.

The last year has seen work and achievement in the following

To commemorate 100 years passing since the beginning of the 1st WW, the Borough Council offered financial assistance towards renovating the war memorial which has now had a fresh coat of paint.

The Parish Council purchased a poppy wreath and made a donation to the Poppy Appeal.

An emergency purchase of a new heater for the Village Hall was made.

With Parish Partnership funding, which is 50:50 funding from Highways (NCC) has seen the purchase and installation of the speed activated sign along the Lynn Road.

Once again, using Parish Partnership Funding the Parish Council has been successful in applying for new speed gates to be installed. These will be positioned along the Low Road and Stow Road access points into the village. Hopefully we will see these installed very soon.

The Parish Council continues to argue the case for the return of the 37 Bus service along Church Road.

The Parish Council, after a lengthy 2 years, negotiated the purchase of the village hall land from Trustee ownership. The sale has officially gone through and we are now waiting for Land Registry confirmation.

The Parish Council had for many years leased the village hall, but only on short term leases. Full ownership will now allow funding to be sort to develop the hall and area if that is what is wanted by the village. So our future intention is to hold a village open meeting where the village hall and its future will be discussed.

All of you will have seen our new style newsletter. This has been a major addition to how the Parish Council communicates with its residents. Feedback has been very supportive and complimentary.

I would like to thank all the Councillors for their commitment and work this past year. I am pleased to say we are now a full Parish Council with no outstanding vacancies.

And also a big thanks to our Clerk, Pippa, without whom we would be rather lost.

Annual Parish Meeting

The meeting was attended by 13 members of the public, and we were pleased to see at least four new village residents.

The formal meeting included the previous years minutes and the Chairman's report opposite.

Parishioners Concerns raised at the meeting included:

The issue of buses was raised and the loss of one of the services through the village meaning the bus shelter now very underused. Though it was felt that the remaining bus service worked well coming through the village.

The 30mph speed limit sign on Church Rd near the school still needs to be removed.

The road on West Way near the shop has a lot of puddles and needs resurfacing as there is a dip in the road.

Issue of cars parking on the pavement in Church Road was raised; this matter has been previously passed to the local PSCO.

Thanks were expressed by parishioner to the Chair J Squires, the Parish Clerk and the rest of the Parish Councillors for all their work.

The next free walk in the village is taking place on Thursday 27th August at 10.30am, meeting at the Chequers pub. The walk is approximately 2.25 miles along lanes, tracks and some roads.

Bus Use Survey

In a continuing effort to have the 37 bus route re instated through the village we published a survey in the last parish newsletter with the aim of gauging and demonstrating support for the service to lobby the operator and Norfolk County Council. From over 300 newsletters distributed we received 7 replies, with the results summarised below.

We await further responses from Norfolk County Council and our MP, before deciding if and how we continue to lobby, though clearly the responses received do not add significant weight to the parish councils campaign.

More convenient.*

As my husband is disabled it would be safer than crossing top road and nearer for us.

Yes, running through the village is more convenient; there is a safe usable bus stop, easily accessed.

For all the reasons stated in the Wimbothsam newsletter May 2015, pages 18-20.

I would like to see 37 bus. It would be safer and help people who live the other end of Westway.

It needs to be running regularly, say every hour and to include an extension to the Downham Market Train Station.

It would be better if we could have another 1/2 hr daily in Downham Market Monday to Saturday. It would help people with Drs and dentist appointments. As far as it goes but its only Downham and for Drs appointments etc., it means taking a taxi.

Not entirely as the timing does not give enough time in Downham Market, less than an hour. It is much appreciated though. We would be at a loss without it.

Another 'extra' service is a 'Pet Service' on Saturday 3rd October. This particular weekend includes the date in the church's calendar when we remember

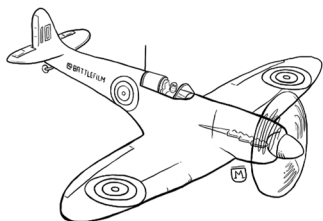
St Francis, so it is an apt occasion to bring pets (any shape or size) to church for a special service.
